

Australia and the UK are in direct support of the U.S. effort to support Taiwan, what actions will these nations take?

- Australia agrees to send frigates from Darwin to the South China Sea for convoy
- Both UK and Australia will send ISR assets to operate out of Japan in support of US operations
- UK continues its convoy support

Japan has deployed naval forces to protect its territory, but remains neutral while allowing U.S. forces base access and logistical support.

Under what conditions might this change?

- Japan has agreed to provide frigates to convoy Japanese and ASEAN flags cargo that has not been scared away by insurance rates.
- In the Senkaku Islands if territorial waters or airspace is intruded upon, this will change the calculus
